

Presidents Page

In the last edition of SAMRAG I wrote about the smells of service - smells that remind you of another time and place during your military career. To this day, whenever a bus pulls up next to me on a street, I am taken back to smelling the waft of diesel smoke the first thing in the morning as I am about to break a night hide.

This time, I would like to write about the sounds of service. I wonder how many others, who have shared the same experience of armoured soldiering and military service, miss:



- Sleeping in your vehicle with non-stop traffic on the radio, and being able to sleep through the chatter, yet being instantly awake when your callsign is spoken
- The Drill Sergeant on parade yelling in your face "What the f#\$k do you think you were doing, you f#\$%@?g drut? (I have since found out that a drut is a backward turd and I am also assured that Drill Sergeants no longer berate recruits in that way)
- The band playing "Radetzky March" or the Pipes and Drums playing "Black Bear"
- The instructor coming into a class and saying, "Sit easy, hats off, smoke if you wish". Those days are thankfully long behind us
- The "whoof" of the choofers being lit first thing in the morning (and sometimes exploding)
- The snoring and farting of your fellow crewmen in a vehicle as you are trying to get to
- The Operations Officer calling over the radio, "You were meant to have crossed the Start Line two minutes ago. Move now. OUT", as you are trying to finish giving orders to your Troop
- The pride you feel when the command is given, "General Salute, Present Arms" and you know you are an important part of a great unit on parade with guidons displaying battle honours from the Boer War, World War One and World War Two

These days, for me, the sounds of service generally start with "Do you remember when....?". There are a lot of shared memories around with current and former soldiers of 3rd /9th Light Horse across the generations. One of the objectives of SAMRA is to provide an opportunity for those who have served over the years and are currently serving to get together to continue the comradeship formed during their service. We do this through Black Hat Nights, "Old and Bold" lunches, our Annual General Meeting (coming up on Wednesday 16 August 2023) and an End-of -Year function as well as informal events such as the SAMRA AFX at Stansbury and get-togethers at The Cumby Hotel. I would love to see SAMRA members encouraging their mates-in-service to join SAMRA and share the comradeship we enjoy.

SAMRA's biggest activity for the year is the Anzac Day memorial service and march. The memorial service continues to be very popular with both SAMRA members as well as the general public. It is held after the Dawn Service on North Terrace and before the Anzac Day march and there continues to be good representation from Federal and State politicians as well as members from local government. The service and wreath laying at the obelisk is always significant. Remembering the horses who served in Palestine and did not return is also very important. The laying of bunches of carrots on the horse trough is particularly poignant. My thanks go to all those who planned and supported the day including James Kennelly, Reg Williams and Dave Mercer from the SAMRA Committee, 3rd / 9th Light Horse for the catafalque party and the Barossa Light Horse re-enactment society. Thanks also to all the SAMRA members who were involved in the march as well as those members who participated in other Anzac Day activities around the world. NEC ASPERA TERRENT

Corporal Greg Hill, currently serving with 3^{rd} / 9^{th} Light Horse, found the following article from the Inniskillings Museum (via Wikipedia) on the Regimental motto: "Nec Aspera Terrent".

The Regimental motto of the Royal Inniskillings Fusiliers was the Latin term "Nec Aspera Terrent" which may have been adopted by the Regiment as early as 1715. The translation used by the Regiment was "By difficulties undaunted" and perhaps, it is a fitting motto for the global crisis facing our community today. Other translations of the motto included the literal "May difficulties not daunt us", as well as the more colourful "They don't terrify the rough ones", "Frightened by no difficulties" and "Difficulties be damned".



3rd/9th Light Horse (South Australian Mounted Rifles), 1st Armoured Regiment has completed battle preparation for its live fire exercise in May.

3/9 LH SAMR is now Army's most modernized reserve Squadron with the Hawkeye PMV-L vehicle, brand new Night Fighting Equipment and suppressed weapons.

A number of other Regiments used the motto and today it is used by the Duke of Lancaster's Regiment, which adopted it from its antecedent Kings (Liverpool) Regiment, the senior line Regiment with the motto. Incidentally, "Nec Aspera Terrent" is also the motto of the RAF Medical Branch, the USA Army's 27th Infantry Regiment (Wolfhounds) and Australia's 3rd / 9th Light Horse (South Australian Mounted Rifles.




