

Presidents Page

On 16th August 2023 the 35th Annual General Meeting of the South Australian Mounted Rifles Association was held. We noted the passing of Jim Harradine, Kym Batchelor and John Candlett as well as the crew who died in a helicopter crash during Exercise Talisman Sabre.

SAMRA has a role to support current members of 3rd / 9th Light Horse including preserving the unit history, organising functions for former members, and maintaining contact with other black hats.

SAMRA's has supported the Squadron by publicising the George Johnson MM memorial prize for a soldier to visit affiliated Regiments in England, and regularly



SAMRA organises functions for members to keep in touch with mates. We have the quarterly SAMRAG magazine, our website and Facebook page, all maintained by Dave Mercer. The Anzac Day Light Horse Memorial service and the march were well attended by SAMRA members and is appreciated by the wider community. Special thanks to James Kennelly and Reg Williams who played key roles in planning for the service. SAMRA hosted Mixed Old and Bold lunches at McLaren Vale, Glenelg North, and Lockleys as well as a Christmas function at the Holdfast Scout Hall. There is also the November get-together at Stansbury Caravan Park. Thanks to Dave Mercer and Reg Williams for making these events happen. SAMRA hosted a Black Hat Night in November 2022. The Commanding Officer of 1st Armoured Regiment, LTCOL Mick Henderson shared his vision of how 3^{rd} / 9^{th} Light Horse would operate under his command, and in June 2023, we visited RAAF Edinburgh to crawl over armoured vehicles including the M1A1 Abrams Main Battle Tank, ASLAV and Hawkei Protected Mobility Vehicle (Light).

SAMRA supported the get-together at The Cumby in March 2023 with 12 people attending. SAMRA has also established a relationship with the 1st Armoured Regiment Association, and we were invited to the Cambrai Parade in November 2022 and the relocation of the 1st Armoured Regiment's original guidon and standard to St Peter's Cathedral in June 2023, both of which were well supported by SAMRA members. We have also been invited to attend the 1st Armoured Regiment Association's reunion in Adelaide in mid-November 2024.

Since last year our membership has gone from 61 life members and 64 ordinary members to 66 life members and 40 ordinary members. Annual membership renewals are being followed up. We offer one years' free membership to attract new members and it is pleasing to see the increase in the number of life members. I am thrilled to see current Squadron members joining as well as memberships from The Cumby get-togethers.

Many thanks to the SAMRA Committee - Vice-President James Kennelly, Past President Reg Williams, Treasurer Peter Byass, Secretary Dave Mercer, committee members Bill McKeough, Bob Ireland, Gerald Hopgood, Steve Langdon, Thom Begg and Warwick Edwards as well as Major Matt Walsh. Gerald will not be continuing, and I wish him well for the future.

SAMRA means different things to different members, with some more active than others. Over the course of the past year, about 70 members have attended one or more event with a small group of about 8 - 10 attending most functions. We continue to provide activities for members and support for the Squadron. This shows that SAMRA is going strong, however, we can never be complacent. The then OC of the LAD, not sure who, arranged to take "all of us" to watch a demonstration of how they would recover a bogged Ferret. My recollection is that they showed it once and then set it up for a repeat. A certain Trooper, or was he a LCPL, I think is was Harnett, said that it wasn't bogged and climbed into the drivers seat and drove it out. A bit embarrassing for the LAD. Regimental members at the time like Erik Fridmanis, Geoff McDuff and Bob Lines may remember the details more accurately.

- 1. We were in Harbour when a Trooper tried to open a soft drink on a Ferret smoke grenade tube in doing so the smoke grenade discharged, the Trooper dropped the softy to pick up the grenade which discharged. Containing phosphate it was burning into his hand. You could hear his scream all over the camp. My CC got the request via radio to pick up Starlight. At speed we barrelled through the camp with him on the outside deck to the injured Trooper who was then taken to the Whyalla Hospital by the Army Ambulance.
- 2. Beer rations we managed to acquire these via the LAD mit ice. HQ got wind of this and raided another camp we were at without success. We had two ways of hiding the goodies (a) Hub cap of the spare wheel. Put a capes half shelter inside with the ice and beer. (b) Dig an "Old Man Salt Bush " up place a cape half shelter in the hole and put ice & beer there in and back fill with the Salt Bush.

As we could not get a network established it was decided to use the vehicles to transfer messages between the various sites. This involved going to wineries with messages and as you can imagine we were offered bottles of wine and the obvious storage space was the ammunition cases on the outside of the Ferret. I remember as we were leading the street parade through town a motorcycle cop patted the side of the vehicle and threatened to check if the side containers had anything in them!

It was a great day out and a memorable trip back to the Gawler depot.

Note: The blue circle insignia on the front of the hull of the Ferret, and the blue scarf under the tank suit.

Note: The sun/wind burn under the white skin on the face designated clearly by the shape of the goggles. Sun screen was not invented then! The result was the surgical removal of 2 carcinomas by plastic surgeons later in life.

3rd/9th was then a regiment, and the vehicle designator tac signs were:

Red triangle - A Sqn - Unley

Yellow Square – B Sqn at Gawler

Blue circle - C Sqn - Unley

The following year I was promoted to Major and posted Sqn Commander B Sqn – wherein lies another story (for later). 'Oscar'




